



Community Services – Lost and Found Animal Resource

Found animals

If you have found an animal you think is someone's lost companion animal, there are actions you can take to help them.

- Check with neighbors in the immediate area the animal was found. Animals usually stay close to home. They will have a higher chance of being reunited with their family within 24 hours.
- Utilize social media to leverage your community to assist. Pages such as YYC Pet Recovery, Pawboost or local community pages can list missing animals, in addition to listing found animals. This may help in reuniting the pet with their guardian.
- Found animals can be taken to any of the emergency clinics in Calgary prior to admittance to either the Calgary Humane Society or Animal Services. Below is a list of all of the emergency clinics in Calgary.

- Contact local animal control in addition to Humane Societies. If the animal has been missing for more than 24 hours, it is likely the animal has been delivered to the appropriate housing facility.
 - Cats and dogs found within Calgary city limits will be directed to Calgary Animal Services.
 - Exotic animals including birds, reptiles and small domestic animals (excluding rabbits*) found within city limits will be directed to Calgary Humane Society.
 - Dog**, cats and exotic animals found outside of Calgary city limits will be directed to Calgary Humane Society.

*Due to the risk posed by Rabbit Hemorrhagic Virus, we are unable to receive stray rabbits unless they are visibly injured.
